2. Business Meeting at 2003 AAG Conference in New Orleans

The Business meeting of the specialty group was held in New Orleans, on Friday, March 7, 2003. Approximately 35 members of the RSSG attended. The meeting was called to order by Vice Chair Tim Warner, because Chair Mark Jakubauskus was not able to attend the meeting, and had offered his resignation effective March 7. Elections were therefore held for a new Chair, Vice Chair, and an additional Director (Directors serve over-lapping terms). The minutes from the 2002 meeting were approved, and a group budget report was presented by the Secretary/Treasurer. The discussion at the business meeting focused on plans for the 2004 meeting in Philadelphia and efforts to stimulate the group, which had been relatively inactive lately. It was noted with pride that the current AAG President, M. Duane Nellis, is a member of the RSSG.

3. 2003 Meeting

2003 RSSG Program Chair, Jane Read (Syracuse University), reported that there were 18 RSSG-sponsored paper sessions, 3 student paper sessions, 4 illustrated paper competitions, and 2 student paper competitions. Dr. Read also discussed some of the difficulties in getting people to submit their papers through the specialty group.

4. Web site & List serve

The main method of communication in the group is the list serve (maintained by Jim Merchant, University of Nebraska) and the web site (maintained by John Althausen, Salem State University).

IV. Future Directions

The RSSG has been relatively quiet recently, especially the last year. The current executive committee is exploring ways of revitalizing the group. We have started an email discussion with an ad hoc group of senior members of the group to share new ideas. In particular, we are discussing plans to move the web site to a new, dedicated URL, institute a new award, check the accuracy of the list serve, organize at least two special issues of remote sensing journals dedicated to the work of our specialty group, and organize special plenary sessions for the 2004 meeting.

V. Membership and Participation

Over the last decade, membership has averaged about 500 members, and is currently at 485. At the end of 2002, the RSSG was the third largest specialty group, surpassed only by the Urban SG (737 members) and GIS SG (1182 members).
